Established in 2023 under the guidance of key advisor Datuk Seri Mustapa Mohamed who initiated this collaborative effort, this network facilitates knowledge sharing, drives coordinated action, and advocates for evidence-based policy development. The platform serves as a catalyst for cross-sector partnerships, enabling diverse organisations to leverage their unique strengths and expertise in pursuit of Malaysia's sustainable development aspirations.

Operating through regular **bi-monthly meetings**, the network has generated significant outcomes including the SDG Conference among public and private universities, strategic collaborations between University of Malaya and the All-Party Parliamentary Group Malaysia for SDGs (APPGM-SDG), and systematic sharing of successes, challenges, best practices, and resources among partners.
