They have been delivered with the expertise and commitment of 42 solution providers, reaching a total of 459 beneficiaries. Each project is designed to address local food needs, strengthen supply chains and equip communities with the knowledge and resources to secure their own nutritional future.

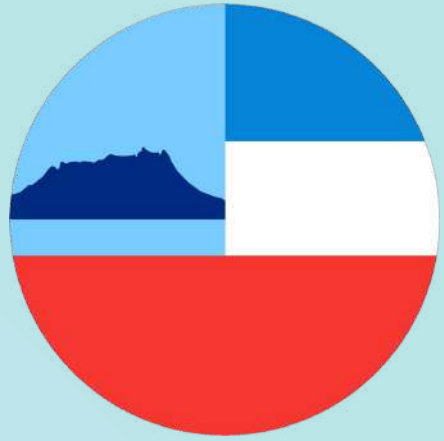
The results demonstrate the value of targeted interventions supported by capable partners who share our vision for a food-secure society.

In the Community-Based Development Project (CBDP) Unit, the Sabah Region has delivered 40 projects, spanning 27 social, 32 economic and 12 environmental initiatives. These were made possible through the involvement of 38 solution providers and have benefited 771 individuals across 20 parliamentary constituencies. The breadth of this work reflects our commitment to holistic community development, fostering inclusion, economic empowerment and environmental stewardship. Together, these efforts contribute to a stronger, more resilient Sabah Region, equipped to face present challenges and future opportunities.

### Pertubuhan Pendidikan dan Kebajikan Projek LEV Sabah



#### Solution Provider:

Pertubuhan Pendidikan dan Kebajikan Projek LEV Sabah started in January 2020 in Kota Kinabalu, Sabah. Its goal is to support education and improve the lives of rural families, help youth and women become leaders, and encourage community volunteering.

#### Project Description

- Collaborated on "The Community Mini Garden Project," where 10 women grew chili peppers and eggplants at home, harvesting about 3 kg weekly. They used homemade compost instead of fertilizer and sold produce at a local market for extra income. Challenges like water shortages and wild animals were solved with solar pumps, better water access, and garden protection. The women also gained skills in composting and marketing.

#### Project Impact:

- The project helped women grow fresh vegetables at home for their families and earn extra money by selling the surplus at local markets.
- Participants learned to make compost fertilizer from natural garden materials, reducing the need for expensive chemical fertilizers.
- Supports SDGs 1, 2, 7, & 17.

### Mudah Laksana Enterprise



### Solution Provider:

The Mudah Laksana Enterprise, established on 31 December 2008, is an organisation focused on implementing impactful community projects, including solar lighting installations and educational support initiatives. It also supports marine conservation and handicraft development, particularly on Banggi Island.

### Project Description:

- Collaborated on the “Program Transformasi Pendidikan: Memperkasa Pelajar dan Memperbaiki Infrastruktur” project, which aims to empower students and improve infrastructure in Kampung Sabur, where residents face limited access to water and electricity. The initiative includes installing a water generator, providing solar lights and study materials, and potentially extending the water supply to homes and schools to improve daily life.

### Project Impact:

- Provided clean water to Kampung Sabur through a water generator system, improving hygiene and reducing the need for manual collection.
- Benefited students with solar lights, study tables, and books, creating a better learning environment at night.
- Fostered community cooperation as villagers work together to manage the system and share fuel costs.
- Contributes to SDGs 1, 7 & 17.

### Legasi Agromart



### Solution Provider:

Legasi Agromart was established in 2020 with a focus on selling animal feed. The organisation is also active in supporting rural communities through food assistance, bridge repairs, and clean water and sanitation projects.

### Project Description:

- Collaborated on the “Menaik Taraf Kolam Tadahan Air” project, which aims to improve water access for villagers by upgrading an existing catchment pond that often dries up during the dry season. The initiative involves deepening and enlarging the pond, cementing its surroundings to prevent erosion, and educating the community on maintenance and water management for long-term sustainability.

### Project Impact:

- Provided a better water supply to villagers through a bigger and deeper catchment pond, especially during the dry season.
- Cemented the area around the pond to prevent erosion and protect the water source.
- Educated the community on maintaining the catchment to keep the water clean and safe.
- Contributes to SDGs 3, 6 & 10.

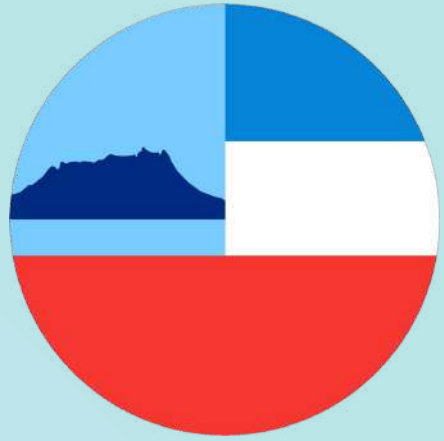

### DD Horizons Sdn Bhd



### Solution Provider:

DD Horizons Sdn Bhd, founded in 2020 by Stanford Dayou, is engaged in agro-tourism, modern agriculture, and freshwater fisheries. It is notably the first organization registered with the Sabah Fisheries Department to operate biofloc fish farming.

### Project Description

- Collaborated on “The Tilapia Farming with Biofloc and Solar Energy” project, where 10 participants managed their own tanks using solar-powered pumps and aeration. The biofloc system recycled fish waste into feed, reducing water changes, saving resources, cutting costs, and minimizing pollution.

### Project Impact:

- Participants learned how to use solar energy and the biofloc system to farm tilapia efficiently while maintaining good water quality.
- The project led to the formation of the Kota Marudu Eco-Agro Community Association (PERKOMGRO) to support local farmers and improve their income.
- Empowers 10 participants with hands-on experience in modern tilapia farming, improving skills and income potential.
- Supports SDGs 1, 2, 7 & 17.

### Borneo Fertilyst



### Solution Provider:

Borneo Fertilyst, founded in 2022 by local youth from Kota Marudu, Sabah, is a social enterprise dedicated to turning agricultural waste into valuable organic products. Its mission is to drive sustainable solutions that benefit rural economies, strengthen the sustainable agriculture sector, and protect the environment.

### Project Description

- Collaborated on Phase 2 of the Organic Corn Community Garden, expanding on Phase 1's harvest of 4,000 plants and RM3,517 income. Participants boosted homemade fertilizer and pest control production, adopted machines and drones for efficiency, improved facilities, explored new income sources like mushrooms and animal feed, continued entrepreneurship training, and pursued MyGAP certification for market access and food safety.

### Project Impact:

- In 3 months, participants sold sweet corn, lemongrass, pepper, and glutinous corn, earning RM2,090, which boosted their income and interest in organic farming.
- They made their own organic fertilizers and pesticides, cutting costs and supporting eco-friendly farming.
- Supports SDGs 1, 2 & 4.

Lexwinabel is a Bumiputera sole proprietorship specializing in the production of gongs and handicrafts. Established on 27 November 2016, the business is based in Kampung Sumangkap, 89058 Kudat, Sabah.

### Project Description

- Collaborated in “Penternakan Ayam Pedaging” project in Kg. Sumangkap, led by Mr. Alexson bin Bahal, involves 11 locals and addresses limited job opportunities in Matunggong, where demand for chicken meat far exceeds supply. The initiative trains participants in broiler farming, enabling them to produce quality chickens, meet market needs, and earn steady incomes. This project helps improve livelihoods, boost local food security, and reduce dependence on external suppliers.

### Project Impact:

- Participants gained practical skills in broiler farming and business management, enabling them to raise and sell chickens successfully.
- The project created a new source of income for participants, improving their livelihoods and supporting local food supply.
- Supports SDGs 1, 8 & 17.

### Project Description:

- Collaborated on the “Projek Pembangunan Pembelajaran Komuniti Kampung Tonsom” project, which aims to empower 50 rural women by upgrading a space into a Community Learning Center. The initiative provides structured training, fosters self-reliance, and builds income-generating skills to strengthen community resilience.

### Project Impact:

- Provided practical skills and entrepreneurship training to empower housewives and single mothers in Kampung Tonsom.
- Enhanced financial independence and long-term livelihood opportunities for B40 women.
- Upgraded the Community Learning Center to support continuous learning and inclusive community development.

Pangrok Sulap, established in 2010, uses art to support social change in rural Sabah. They help communities by building craft houses, donating traditional instruments, and running art workshops. They also build pico hydro systems to bring electricity to remote villages.

#### Project Description:

- Collaborated on the “Projek Air Graviti Kg Tagibang,” which installs a community-managed gravity water system to provide clean, safe, and affordable water to all 38 households, reducing the need to collect water from distant or unsafe sources, and incorporates art-based fundraising to supply water filters for the village.

#### Project Impact:

- Provided reliable access to clean and safe water for all 38 households in the village.
- Strengthened community resilience with low-cost, flood-resistant water infrastructure.
- Empowered the community through local management and maintenance of the gravity water system.
- Raised funds through art-based initiatives to support the purchase of water filters.

- Contributes to SDGs 1, 4 & 8.

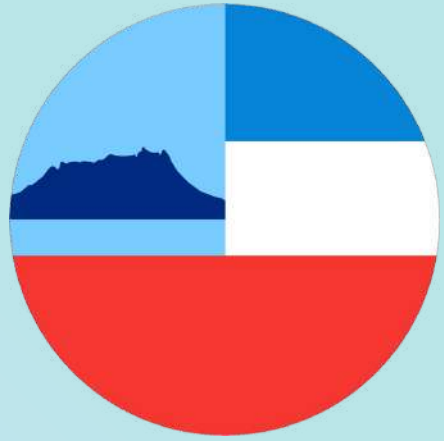

- Supports SDGs 1, 2 & 12.

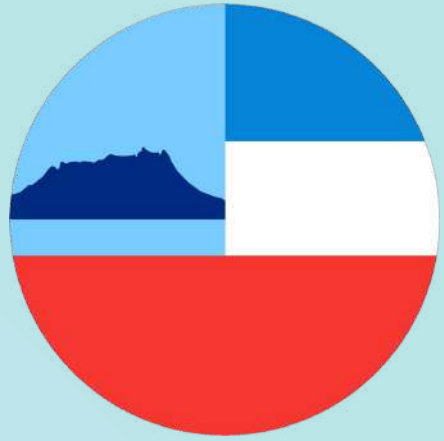

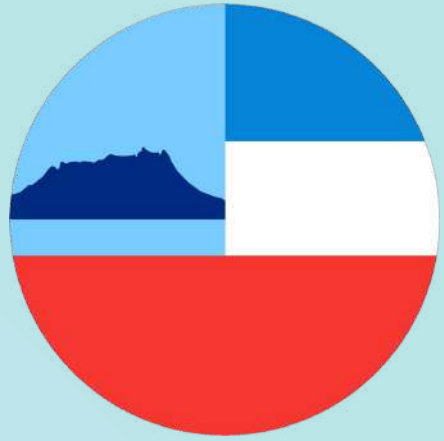
